VILLAGE OF PORT LEYDEN
LOCAL LAW 5 FOR 2023

Section 1. - Title. This local law shall be entitled the "Revised ATV and Snowmobile Law of the Village of Port Leyden, New York".

Section 2. - Statement of Authority. The purpose of this Local Law is to protect the public health, welfare and safety by regulating the operation of all terrain vehicles and snowmobiles within the Village of Port Leyden which will promote their safe and proper use and minimize detrimental effects. The prior "ATV and Snowmobile Law of the Village of Port Leyden, New York", Local Law No. 2 for 2023, is hereby repealed and replaced in its entirety.

Section 3. - Definitions. The term "ATV" or "all-terrain vehicle" shall have the same definition in this law as it does in Vehicle and Traffic Law Article 48B § 2281 as enacted. The term "snowmobile" shall have the same definition in this law as it does in Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation law § 21.05(3) as enacted.

Section 4. - Operation Conditions and Restrictions on land. Neither an ATV nor snowmobile shall be operated on any lands owned or occupied by the Village of Port Leyden. Neither an ATV nor snowmobile shall be operated on any privately owned lands except with the written permission of any such owner/occupant, except that a person may operate an ATV or snowmobile on his/her own land without such permission. The operator of an ATV or snowmobile shall carry written permission (when required) while operating an ATV on private lands. The operator of the ATV shall produce evidence of such permission to any legally authorized enforcement officer.

Section 5. - Use on Public Village Ways prohibited. ATV and snowmobile travel on Village streets and highways shall be prohibited except for special events permitted at the discretion of the Village Board.

Section 6. - Additional regulations. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this local law, this section 6 shall apply to all operators and owners.

1. All ATV and snowmobile operators and owners shall comply with applicable county, state, and federal laws as they pertain to ATV and snowmobile use and ownership.
2. ATV and snowmobile operation is prohibited after sunset and before sunrise.

3. It shall be unlawful to operate an ATV or snowmobile in any manner which creates a loud, unnecessary, or unusual noise so as to disturb or interfere with the peace and quiet of other persons or in any other manner which constitutes a public nuisance or annoys or injures or endangers the health, safety, comfort or repose of the public. No person shall use a muffler cutout, bypass, or other devices to defeat the operation of a muffler in good working condition.
4. It shall be unlawful to operate an ATV or snowmobile on a public sidewalk or walkway.

Section 7. - Penalties for Offenses.

1. An offense against this local law shall be deemed a violation.
2. For any conviction after a hearing before a court of competent jurisdiction, a fine of not less than \$100 or more than \$1,000 may be imposed.

Section 8. - Effective Date. This law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
